During this meeting, we continued to urge the Commission to adopt the recommendation of USAC's 2003 Task Force on the Prevention of Waste, Fraud and Abuse, which was to place a sensible limit on how much E-rate funding applicants may apply for annually. We also responded to a wide range of questions related to our proposal and, more specifically, whether and how it would help to effectuate the President's ConnectEd initiative.
