Request Regarding Broadband Connectivity in the Schools and Libraries
Program in Funding Year 2011

Dear Ms. Hone:

Pursuant to a request from Federal Communications Commission (FCC) staff, USAC is providing updated information and data regarding broadband connectivity funding requests in the Schools and Libraries Program for Funding Year 2011. In response to this request, USAC has prepared a report that provides the following information: (1) the category of service (*i.e.*, Internet Access or Telecomm Services); (2) the product and function type as listed in the FCC'S Eligible Services List; (3) the number of FCC Form 471 funding requests that have been filed for these services; (4) the total post-discount requested amount of funding for each product type; and (5) the post-discount total committed amount of funding for each product type. Data for each of these lines is based on information received on FCC Forms 471 filed during the application window. For those funding requests that contain a mix of products or services, the request is classified by the predominant service or product being requested, as defined by the quantity of services. For example, if a single funding request contained one T-1 line and four T-3 lines, for the purposes of this report, the request would be classified as T-3 lines. The report that provides this information is attached to this letter.
